



Skin lesion removal

WHAT I REMOVE:

Moles

small growths of skin pigment

Skin tags

soft, hanging bits of skin often on the neck or underarms

Seborrhoeic keratoses

harmless, “wart-like” brown spots common with age

Warts

caused by viruses, rough and raised

Haemangiomas

red “cherry” spots or clusters of blood vessels

Cysts

small sacs under the skin filled with fluid or keratin

Lipomas

soft, fatty lumps beneath the skin

Keloids

thick, raised scar tissue that grows beyond the original wound

Suspicious lesions

anything that may be cancerous and needs further analysis

HOW I REMOVE IT:

All procedures are done under local anaesthetic in a safe, sterile environment

- meaning the area is numbed, so you won't feel pain during removal.

Healing time depends on the type of lesion and method used.



Surgical Excision

cutting out the lesion completely (often with stitches)



Curettage

gently scraping away the lesion



Cauterization

burning away tissue with heat for quick removal



Cryotherapy

freezing the lesion with liquid nitrogen

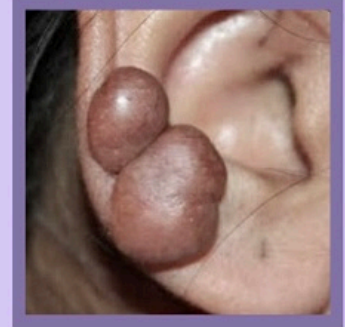

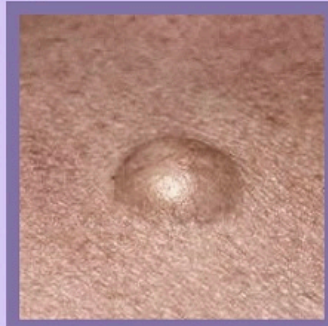
